



A well-known African proverb says that 'you need a town to raise a child.' Well, this is the story of the town that raised me.






I have an older brother and a sister who taught me how to get along well with others







I have a bunch of aunts and uncles who showed me the importance of using my talents for good.




My older and younger cousins were like my first circle of friends, and we learned things together.

The town that raises a child isn't made only of family members.


There are other very important people who helped me develop into who I am today.

For example, my neighbors who showed me a sense of community and shared responsibility.






My friends over the years, with whom I could try new and different things without consequences.
