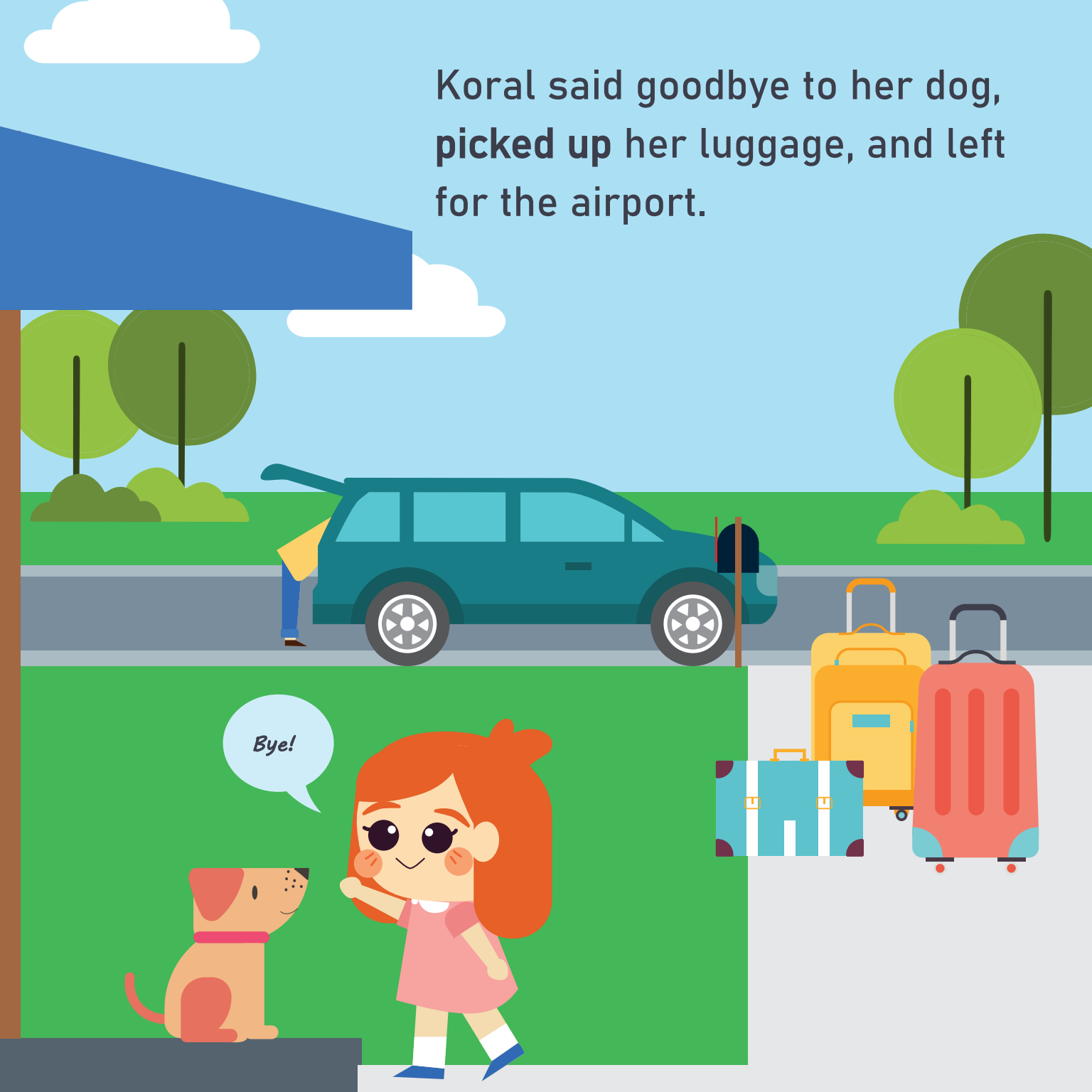
Flight Attendant





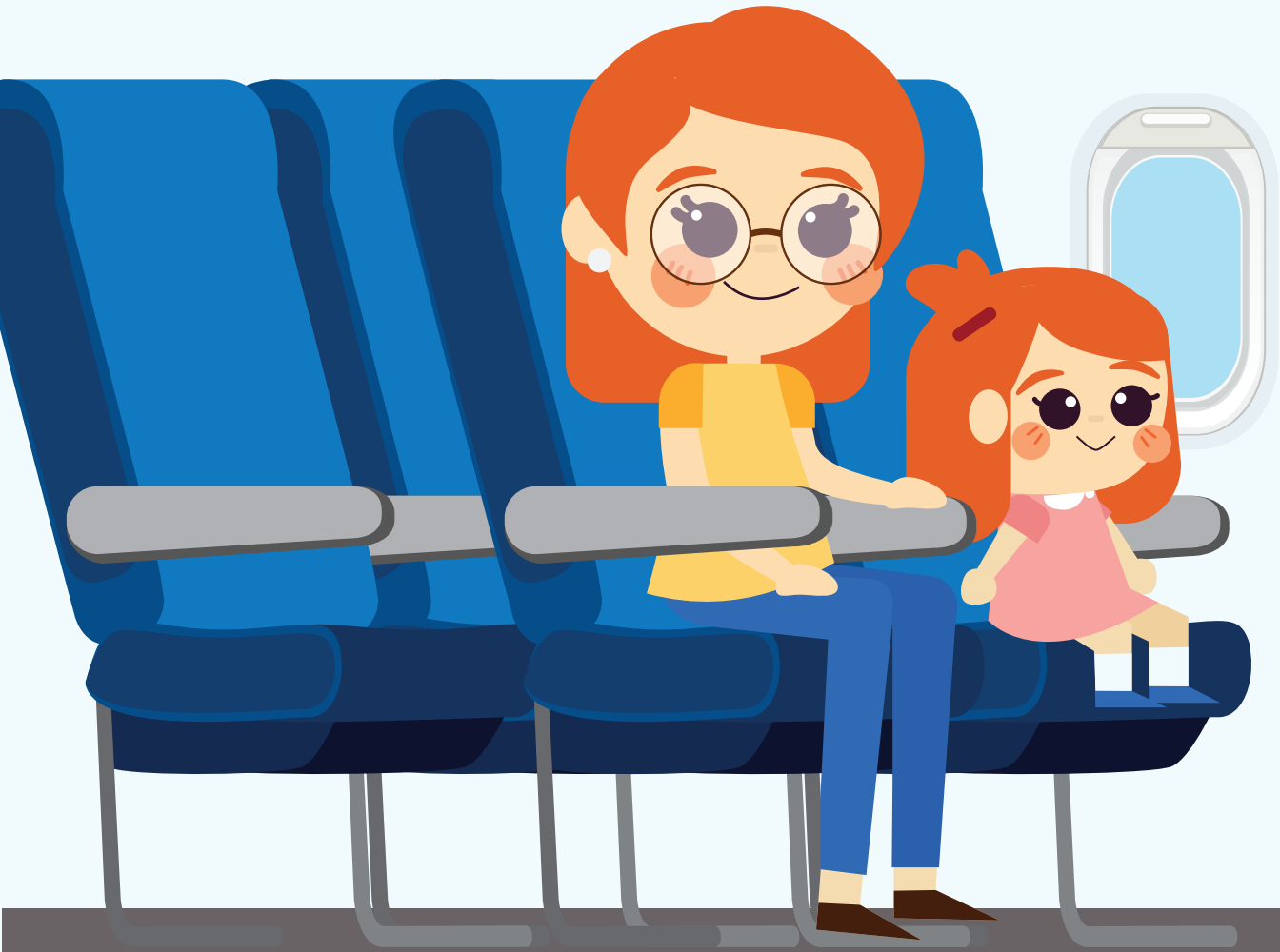
Koral opened her eyes and jumped out of bed. She was very happy because she was getting on a plane today. She was going to visit Taiwan with her mom.
